A very special thank you goes to our guest speaker, Mr. Travis Gibson. Mr. Gibson has authored several books that he book talked during the January meeting.



Delta Kappa Gamma Society International Delta Epsilon Chapter - Regular Meeting Minutes of January 13, 2015 Pine Ridge Elementary School Library - Livingston, Texas

The meeting was called to order by Sherry Kenner explaining that our state and international theme is

"Expand the Vision: Educate, Inspire, Encourage." Melinda Stryker read the Collect. Sherry asked Charlotte Hartley to introduce our grant-in-aid recipient, Caitlyn Anderson. At that time the grant was presented to Caitlyn and it was explained that Heather Wood from Woodville would be presented the grant-in-aid at our meeting in February. Our guest speaker was introduced by Paula Kimbro. Travis Gibson, former superintendent of Livingston Independent School District, turned author has written four books. Travis Gibson first recommended the following authors to our membership. Stewart O'Nan who wrote, Soup for the Missing and Last Night at the Red Lobster. Clyde Edgerton wrote Walk across Egypt and Lunch at the Piccadilly. Louise Shaffer wrote The Three Miss Margarets. Hillary Mantel wrote Wolf All and Bring up the Bodies. Authors Joe Coomer and Wally Lamb were also mentioned. Travis then mentioned the four books he has written. They were Southern Gospel, Pearline's Pretty Good Year, Salt of the Earth, and Ardelia. He spent time reading the Prologue of Ardelia and captured the interest of all present. Reading from Pearline's Pretty Good Year, he had all the members laughing.

Sherry thanked Mr. Gibson and presented a bookmark signed by all the members present. Sherry then gave each member present a book mark. All present were asked to sign a sympathy card for the Jenarie E. Alexander family. Lucy Kuntz was asked to honor Jenaire Alexander at one of our meetings. (3×5) Cards were distributed by Sherry.
